



Library Instruction in the West Shore School District

Library and Information skills instruction in the West Shore School District are aligned to the PA Core Standards and identified best practices. We utilize a variety of strategies and differentiate our instruction to meet the needs of all learners. Technology and 21st Century Skills are thoughtfully woven into our lessons and units of instruction. This document is meant to offer an overview of important concepts at each grade level.

Best Practices in 6th Grade Library and Information Skills:

- Model and practice appropriate library behaviors and expectations.
- Orientation program.
- Model and practice library organization through hands on methods such as book selection, games, scavenger hunts, library catalog, mapping, digital resources.
- Model and practice determining the quality & reliability of information using strategies such as compare and contrast, detection of bias and author's purpose.
- Model and practice determining website quality using RADCAB.
- Encourage students to read and discuss literature independently.
- Use subscription databases, WebPath Express and Power Library.
- Review the information found in the reference section.
- Introduction to proper citation methods.
- Programs stressing the importance of academic honesty in an effort to curtail plagiarism.
- Examples and websites stressing the importance of online safety.
